Academy policies

- ❖ All applicants interested in attending a course at Veridicus International Polygraph Academy must fill out an application that must be sworn to and notarized.
- ❖ Provide a criminal record as proof that the applying student has not been convicted of a felony unless the applicant is currently in law enforcement or holds a state certification which requires a criminal record check (all foreign students must submit to a polygraph examination)
- ❖ No applicant will be admitted into the academy where there is proof that the applicant is involved in any criminal activities.
- ❖ The tuition fee of the course will be \$4000.00 unless other arrangements or costs are previously agreed upon.
- ❖ Any applicant that is not admitted into the course will be reimbursed the full amount of the of tuition fee (foreign student will be charged 250.00 for their polygraph examination).
- ❖ In case that a student decides to leave the course while the course is in session the student will be entitled to 50% within the first 3 weeks and no reimbursements thereafter.
- ❖ All students are required by APA standards to attend 90% of the course unless core classes are not attended then the student must make arrangements with the director for a waiver to attend the missed core classes during the time provided. All missed instructions will be given to students after hours if necessary unless an instructor is not available.



- ❖ Any student that cannot continue the course because of situations beyond their control will be evaluated on a case by case basis given an opportunity to attend the next course.
- ❖ All course instruction will be given to each individual by using a digital storage thumb drive and/or will be given the material necessary to make any paper prints.
- ❖ All students will be given a minimum of 8 weekly exams and one final exam where students must maintain a 75% average overall.
- ❖ All students will be required to maintain their working space clean, free of clutter and trash.
- ❖ Any person who is accused of any crime during the course will be dealt with in accordance with the laws of this state.
- ❖ Any student or staff whose conduct is unbecoming of a professional will be asked to leave after 1 warning.
- ❖ Any student who conducts real polygraph examinations while attending the course will be dismissed from the course without reimbursement of course tuition.
- ❖ Students are required to fill out a survey 12 months after the course to insure that information of Job placement in the field of polygraph and any achievements during those 12 after the course.



Complaints about other students should be in writing and will be dealt by meeting with the directors to find a solution to any complaints. Copies of complaints will be filed and made available for inspection by the American Polygraph Association Accreditation Committee.
